Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify a sentence which shows an underlined fronted adverbial which has been used in a sentence with up to two simple clauses or phrases.

Expected Identify a sentence which shows an underlined fronted adverbial within two expanded clauses.

Greater Depth Identify an underlined fronted adverbial within sentences which include multiple clauses and adverbials.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Decide whether commas have been used to mark fronted adverbials accurately within two simple sentences.

Expected Decide whether commas have been used to mark fronted adverbials accurately within two expanded clauses.

Greater Depth Decide whether commas have been used to mark fronted adverbials accurately in sentences which include multiple clauses and adverbials.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Prove whether a given statement is true using knowledge of fronted adverbials. Adverbials are used in sentences with up to two simple clauses or phrases.

Expected Prove whether a given statement is true using knowledge of fronted adverbials. Adverbials are used within two expanded clauses.

Greater Depth Prove whether a given statement is true using knowledge of fronted adverbials. Sentences include multiple clauses and adverbials.
