Vocabulary

sketch map	a map drawn from observation and representing the main features of an area
aerial view	looking directly down on an area
annotation	a note by way of explanation
landmark	an object or feature of an area, e.g. school, church
key	the key on a map or diagram is a list of the symbols used and their meanings
symbol	a mark used to represent an object
cartographer	somebody who draws and produces maps
scale	the relationship between distance on a map to distance on the ground
urban	belonging to, or relating to, a town or city
rural	places that are far away from large towns or cities
population	all the people who live in a country or area
agriculture	farming and the methods that are used to raise and look after crops and animals
forestry	an area of land covered by forest
protected land	areas of land reserved for protecting nature
coastal	an area of land close to the sea
freshwater	naturally occurring water (e.g. lakes)

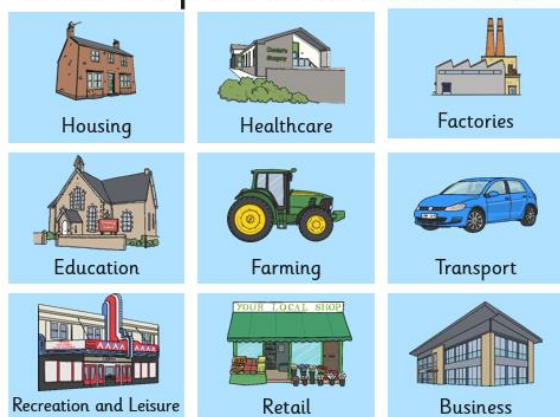


What makes a good sketch map?
